LET'S TALK ABOUT CELILO!!

OK, we will do just that, but understand that we just experienced the worst Spring weather in record keeping history. Finally, after this event the "Fish Gods" allowed CRB to go out on the Celilo pool without wind and rain as it has been in the past for two months. Randy "Zip" Decker and his draw partner Joe Badolato executed their plan on flats with less current, near underwater breaks, with scattered boulders and rocks. They cranked two in the morning on flats and then switched to dark colored tubes and fished a little deeper for the remainder of the day. They rotated three spots with rests in between. They had a limit by nine-thirty and were culling 3lb fish by noon with only ounces between each fish. Then Joe set the hook on a fish over four pounds. This allowed for the solid consistent bag of 16.53lb, which was more than 2lb over second place for their First Place finish!

SECOND PLACE 14.08#

Pictured to the left is Shon Childers holding two 3lb fish that he caught from the backseat of Chuck Smith's boat. Shon, as you know, is a multi AOY with CRB, normally fishing from his Ranger. As you also may know Shon "blew" his Yamaha in the CFC, and he drew out backseat with Chuck and it didn't matter. They did not pre-fish and found this 14lb weight culling many quality fish, thru three limits. I spoke to Chuck and he wanted me to express what a pleasant day he had from his back seat as he let Shon run the front. They primarily fished rock flats in 3ft-12ft. They caught almost all of their fish on half ounce Red Eye Shad in crawdad and shad pattern and 3# bass at the marina entrance!



THIRD PLACE 13.19#

Here's Joe Doyle holding up two quality small mouth from their limit that he caught from the back seat of Tim Ihle's Ranger. Tim and Joe threw hard baits in the rattle trap variety, mixed in with select crank baits. They, like many anglers in this event, experienced a tough morning with the bite coming on stronger in the afternoon making the needed adjustments from other baits they were throwing earlier. Joe may be new to CRB, but not new to catching quality smallmouth as you can see here! With help from you, Joe, Tim has now moved into 2^{nd} place for the season with 92 points from this event and a big 264 points overall! When the non-boater is putting fish in the live well like the ones you have caught here this really helps the team's 5 fish limit!

I spoke with Gary on the phone about his 4.44 big fish for the Celilo event. He did have the opportunity to pre-fish this event with his draw partner, Bob Larimer. They fished on the Friday before our tournament and had an above average pre-fish. I was surprised to find that Gary had only fished Celilo four times. They proved their ability by going out and culling a solid 11.43# along with this big fish of 4.44#. She was caught on a custom jig in 12 feet of water in crawdad pattern. I enjoyed speaking with Gary as we spoke about many common subjects of fishing in California. I did not know that Gary had fished as many places there as I have and we spoke for quite a while about this.

NEWS LETTER EDITOR'S REVIEW OF CELILO

Hard to believe that we just completed our third CRB event with Celilo. I mentioned at the beginning of our newsletter that the Pacific Northwest has seen some record braking temperatures and rain totals, and still today as I write these words we will see a record broken for "lowest high temperature" at 52 degrees! This trend should of, by the text book, have effected our Celilo fish catch more than it did...but along came a beautiful, rare windless day, and bang the CRB anglers brought them to the scales! Every angler caught bass and some of you were culling three pound species to get your winning bags! I, like most CRB anglers, did not get a prefish. Thanks to a grest draw in my partner being Rob Allen, he put us on fish that I could not! I had two lucky bites with a swim bait and one on a grub, as my unfortunate partner lost three lures that I am sure would have helped our bag had he been able to break them free from the snags. However, I believe, "Not hanging up..not catching bass"! Sure enjoyed the day!

The same week as our Celilo event last year our CRB club was fishing The Dalles. My first prefish before the event (2 weeks out) was simply fantastic! I had blade fish and crank fish, many over three pounds and two fours! The week before our tourney I got a call from one of my oldest and dearest fishin' buddies who informed me he was going to be in town the same weekend as our CRB event. Take into consideration he has never fished the Columbia for smallies and my prefish and I go to our club meeting and ask to be taken out of the draw and be allowed to just weigh in what ever we would catch, as club rules are quite clear that before the draw we can not choose our partners. Pictured here are the results. A 4.51 and a 3.20 caught by my friend Lee, from Helena, Montana part of our 15.78 bag! A classic Jack Nicolson movie in mind for me of fulfilling a "bucket list"!
